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General specifications for graduates of BSN (Specialist)

At the end of the program, the student will be able to:

1. Use general and specialized skills and information, as well as the ability to solve community problems.
2. Provide specialized comprehensive nursing care that meets the needs of the individual, family and community.
3. Use creative and constructive thinking at work through the use of research evidence.
4. Adhere to the knowledge, values, and standards of general nursing ethics related to the various specializations.
5. Communicate effectively with patients in order to provide the necessary care for participation with the health team members.
6. Provide health advice and consultation to patients and their families based on their health and social needs.

Scientific Degree

The University Council grants a bachelor's degree in specialized nursing sciences at the request of the Faculty of Nursing Council, when the student fulfills the requirements for obtaining 140 credit



Studying Duration

The study's duration to obtain a bachelor's degree in specialized nursing sciences is eight semesters (16 weeks\semester). The student must pass the internship year, which is a calendar year (12 months), equivalent to 36 actual hours per week (Bachelor of Nursing Internship Regulation).

General Conditions for Program's Admission



The faculty is subjected to the admission system of Egyptian universities in force in the country, and it is required that female or male students must fulfill the following conditions:

1. The student must have a certificate of secondary education in sciences or an equivalent, in accordance with the rules and regulations set by the Supreme Council of Universities.
2. The student should be free to study.
3. The first foreign language that the student studies should be English.
4. Passing admission tests in accordance with the rules and regulations set by the College Council.
5. The student must pass the medical examination, which must demonstrate that the student is free of physical or mental disabilities, chronic diseases, or infectious diseases, and that the student's height and weight are consistent).
6. International students have the same general conditions for acceptance as their Egyptian counterparts, in accordance with the rules set by the Supreme Council of Universities.
7. Acceptance of students with diplomas from Technical Nursing Institutes and Health Technical Institutes (Nursing Division).
